EPISCOPAL CHURCH WOMEN HONOR ANNA CILLA PAUL LAYTON

How best to describe our honoree? When asked by Jeri Knox, a family friend who endeavored to do a short bio several years ago for a then up and coming event for the Middlebury College Bicentennial in Vermont, she responded "Classically trained, emotionally charged, I sing because I know no other way to fulfill the yearning in my spirit." Anna Cilla was born in 1931 to Anna & Joseph Paul at City Hospital in Newark, NJ. Both of her parents emigrated from the island of St. Kitts. They came to America in search of a better life for their family. As a young girl at age ten, Anna began singing in the Youth choir at St. Philip's Church which used to rest on New and High streets in Newark, NJ. This is where it all began. With the guidance of organist, Dr. Arthur Stephens, Anna blossomed as a young singer. Despite the fact that she was coming up in a tumultuous time in our country back in 1942 when there was much racial division and tension, World War II loomed large in American life, many young men were being drafted, as was her brother, Nathaniel. During this time her dear father, Joseph, passed away. Anna continued to sing, she continued to flourish. Her mother and her sister Thirielda always encouraged her to "let them hear your voice." And she did!

Her talent was recognized and encouraged while she attended East Orange High School, by her teacher, Ms. Kathleen Chrisman. At the age of fifteen, Anna studied voice at the Metropolitan Opera House studios in Manhattan under the direction of Ms. Kathleen Chrisman. Ms. Chrisman would continue private lessons for Anna well beyond graduation and into her adult life. After graduating from East Orange High School in 1949, her mother surprised her with a trip to ST. Kitts, WI the island home from which her parents came. It was then that her star began to rise. Anna performed in a series of concerts and recitals sponsored by The Methodist Church and St John's Church of Tabernacle in Basse Terre, St. Kitts. This was an extraordinary time for Anna and her mother. She headlined several operas and cantatas to help the local churches raise money for various fund-raising events. Dr. Arthur Stephens, the organist at St Philip's Church back home also graciously mailed her additional sheet music to Basse Terre to help her keep up with the demands of the concerts she was performing. Anna was having the time of her life being treated like royalty. And thus, a Diva was born.

After returning to the states, betwixt working in Bamberger's department store and General Instrument & Co., she continued singing with the Youth Choir of St Philip's Church. It was there that she met her beau and husband, Warren Layton (deceased). They fell in love and were married in 1953.

They were blessed with a beautiful family of three daughters, Joanne Brown (Kelvin), Cheryl Cooper (Sidney), and Laura Layton and five grandchildren and two great grandchildren. After the merger of St. Philip's Church congregation with Trinity & St. Philip's Cathedral, a Gospel Choir was formed which spanned over decades. Anna and Warren sang together until his passing in 2006.

We honor Anna today for the gift of 75 years of Service music. Her tenacity and pursuit of excellence in all things be it her family life or music life stands out. This has been an exquisite lyric Soprano voice to the following groups, The Orange Majestic Singers, under the direction of Albert Tillery, The Polyphonic Chorale, under the direction of Elaine Jones, The Newark Community Concert Choir, under the direction of Dr. Conrad Brown, The Harlem Spiritual Ensemble, under the direction of Dr. Francois Clemmons, The Essex Chorale, under the direction of Dr. DeCosta Dawson and The Oratorio Society of New Jersey, under the direction of Dr. Sandor Scado.

On any given Sunday, you can hear her singing from the loft of this great Cathedral, as she has done since she was just a girl. Anna's dedication to service continues to inspire greatness in us all. Thank you Anna for sharing your beautiful voice, one of your many gifts God has bestowed upon you to share with us at the Cathedral for the past 75 years.

Anna also serves as a life-long member of The Sons & Daughters of St. Christopher Benevolent & Charitable Society of NJ Inc.

Suzan Johnson Cook 3rd Ambassador at Large for International Religious Freedom for the United States of America Term Appointed: May 2011 – October 2013

For the past four and a half years, a two year Senate Confirmation hearing process and two and a half years in the post, (from May 2011-October 2013) Ambassador Suzan Johnson Cook (Ambassador Sujay) served as the 3rd Ambassador at Large for International Freedom for the United States of America.

Nominated by Secretary Hillary Rodham Clinton and appointed by President Barack Obama, Suzan Johnson Cook was the principal advisor to the President and Secretary of State, integrating Religious Freedom in the Foreign Policy and National Security discussions.

Having served two US Presidents and three members of the Cabinet, Suzan Johnson Cook is highly regarded as an international Influencer, Faith Leader, and Diplomat bridging party, racial and gender divides. ESSENCE magazine named her as one of the top 40 POWER women in 2011, along with First Lady Michelle Obama; EBONY magazine named her amongst the top 150 in 2010, and most recently MOVES magazine named her a POWER MOVES woman in 2013.

Currently, she is a Distinguished Visiting Fellow at the Catholic University of America, and building a movement, ProVoice, to help celebrate Black and Latina women, and help get them into key leadership positions, to become both a political and economic force.

A native New Yorker, Suzan Johnson Cook and her family live in Washington DC and New York. She has been the Senior Pastor of three congregations, and is known for her transformational and impactful lunchtime services on Wall Street. Author of

ten books, including three bestsellers, she has delivered more than 2,500 speeches, traveled to and led delegations throughout five continents, and lived in Spain and West Africa.
